In support of the Kentucky Guild Chapter:

Summer Auction – money-making project consisting of crafts, baked goods, etc. made/donated by members. Monies are used to help finance the national meeting every fourth year when Kentucky is the host and to support the local guild scholarship fund. Two dollars of each member’s dues go towards the scholarship fund as well.

Dues:

Dues are twenty (\$20) per year *payable on or before June 1*. Newly recognized members do not pay dues the year they are received into membership. (The chapter pays the new member’s dues to National.) Membership year runs from June 1 to May 31. Checks should be made payable to ***Kentucky Master Farm Homemaker Guild*** and sent (given) to the chapter treasurer.

Individuals who do not renew their membership are contacted for two consecutive years. If at the end of the two-year, period they have not paid dues in full, they are moved to the inactive membership list and do not receive mailing for the Kentucky Guild chapter.

Meetings:

- Spring business meeting and recognition of new members – April/May in connection with the Kentucky Extension Homemakers Association Annual Meeting.
- Summer business meeting and informal gathering – often in July/August but scheduled according to dates recommended by the individual(s) hosting the activity. The summer meeting is usually hosted by one or more Master Farm members at or near their homes. The Guild usually has an auction of crafts and other items made/brought by members. This is the only money-making project in support of Guild activities.
